

Resolution 3.1

27th June 1950

Sponsors: Republic of China, Ecuador, France, Norway, United Kingdom, United States of America, Yugoslavia

The Security Council,

Viewing with grave concern the situation in Korea,
Reiterating the importance of economic and social development in the Korean peninsula,

Noting that the intention of member nations is to create a democratically elected government in a reunified Korea,

Noting with concern the refusal of the North Korean government to cooperate with the UN,

Reiterating the importance of educational development and the provision of aid to the Korean peninsula,

1. Decides to establish an organisation known as United Nations Developmental Organisation in Korea (UNDOK) which would:
 - a) be divided into a Commission and a Foundation;
 - b) allow the Commission to give feed back from the actual region and recommend developmental measures to the Security Council;
 - c) allow the Foundation to implement these recommendations according to the directives of the Security Council;
2. Decides that the responsibilities of the Organization would be divided into:
 - a) Establishing a strong social system which would provide better healthcare, unemployment benefits and a basic infrastructure;
 - b) Implementing an educational system that is in accordance with the values of the UN charter and the principle of representative government. The UNDOK would help an established government implement and improve their educational policy and improve the general standards of education;
 - c) Allowing a safe passage for return of the refugees and basic food and shelter for the displaced refugees;
 - d) Decreasing the disparity of the North and the South by providing measures for better living standards;
 - e) Encouraging increased cultural interaction between the North and the South populace;
 - f) Providing information concerning the possibility and the exact timeline of free democratic elections throughout Korea;
3. Decides that the safety of the equipment and the personnel of the organization be ensured by providing UN Peace-keeping troops;
4. Encourages increased interaction between the UN and the North Korean government and recommends the General Assembly to grant observer status to the states of North and South Korea;
5. Decides that talks will take place during the next Security Council Meetings concerning the free democratic elections throughout Korea.
