The Austrian delegation to Isar Model United Nations 2012 consisted of four delegates and one chair. In four committees namely Security Council, European Union, Syria Conference and Human Rights Council, our delegation had the challenging task of representing mostly P-5 states. Since 2008 IsarMUN has gained more and more delegates every year.

Between Friday 14 December to Sunday 16 December, IsarMUN attracted a broad variety of international and national participants, which resulted in a high level of negotiations. The conference was held at the “Akademie für Politische Bildung” (Academy of Civic Education) in Tutzing.
