


The final settlement on May 21, 2007



Description:

- 1. Nuremberg and Hof ceded to Bavaria by Prussia
- 2. Palatinate, Mainz and the southern Rhineland (the river Moselle as the border) to Bavaria
- 3. Rhineland and Westphalia to Prussia
- 4. East Frisia to Hanover
- 5. Saxony remains an independent kingdom, loses 40% of its territory to Prussia, but retains Leipzig; Torgau goes to Prussia
- 6. Torun and the area around remains within Prussia
- 7. Creation of the Kingdom of Poland and Galicia (ceded by Austria) with its own constitution, in personal union with Russia
- 8. Cracow and adjacent area (ceded by Russia and Prussia) go to Austria
- 9. France's border of 1792 is recognized; France becomes one of the committee of the five, regains de-facto the status of great power. Further decision of the Congress needs France's consent.
